None of our achievements would have been possible without the remarkable support of generous partners and donors. 

Witron, a global leader in intralogistics, faces a demand for PLC specialists in its USA project. Despite efforts to train specialists in the USA, the skills shortage persists. Hence Witron and Gabera train Nigerien PLC specialists to work on short-term assignments on US construction sites while remaining resident in Niger. Simultaneously, they train the next generation of specialists in Niger.

By creating highly attractive jobs in Niger, the concept of circular migration ensures the prevention of brain drain.

# INTEGRATED SCHOOL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

# Niger's education system crisis

Niger faces a persistent learning crisis, with an adult literacy rate of only 38% and around 88% of 15-year-old students performing far below the minimum competency level in literacy and numeracy skills (UNESCO, 2023). The current challenges from issues like inefficient and complicated teaching administration, and a lack of transparency. Administrators of the average Nigerien school with 2.000 students spend several weeks annually manually preparing class enrollment lists. This manual workload consumes valuable time and adversely impacts student learning success.

# Co-designing a tool with teachers, school principals and parents


We built the first version of a free, opensource and modular school management and learning platform to reduce corruption and increase student learning outcomes. In a pilot phase we worked with 10 schools with a total of 20,000 pupils.

Gabera Foundation focused on delivering the digital product by codesigning it with teachers, schools principals, local governments, and university students, supported with apt user insights. Users' involvement was ensured through a comprehensive research and engagement process.

### **Official Product Launch**

On October 22, 2023, we launched the first version of our School Management Platform. Representatives of the Ministry of Higher Education, Research and Technological Innovation were present as well as our project partners, including 25 school principals and 10 representatives of parental committees.






# CODING AND ROBOTICS DAYS

We have conducted 4 Robotics Days at Nigerien schools and universities to bring young people, in particular women, into coding, while developing tech and leadership skills. These skills education days and experiential learning opportunities are designed to broaden the view of young people and help them develop skills they will need for their future professional lives.

50+ students participated in a full or half day of age-appropriate experiential, hands-on, and fun learning journey geared toward technical skills, in particular coding, and soft skills, such as critical thinking, problem-solving, social and emotional skills.

Gabera Foundation provided expertise, ICT equipment, training materials, and professional guidance for the participants.



# TRADITIONAL EARTH ARCHITECTURE MEETS SMART TECHNOLOGY

# Buildings make up the world's largest source of CO2 emissions

Niger, one of the world's hottest countries, grapples with regions that are already barely habitable today. The indoor climate in conventional concrete buildings is excessively hot and uncomfortable. Globally, the construction sector contributes 40% of the CO2 emissions. New pathways must be envisioned to enable comfortable, climate-adapted, and eco-friendly living.

# Embracing Earth as a sustainable alternative in construction

Exploring alternatives to the prevailing unsustainable model, one promising option is harnessing earth and other traditional materials. Earth is a cheap, 100% natural and 100% recyclable material that has the unique capacity to naturally cool down indoor spaces, minimizing reliance on air conditioning.

# Combining earth buildings with new technology and afro-futuristic feel

In Africa, earth architecture suffers from an image problem. It is perceived as "primitive architecture for the poor". This image is hard to shake. We believe that two key factors can redefine the allure of earth buildings: First, integrating new technologies into the construction process to ease work. Second, embracing a modern design approach and elements of tech-savvy, smart housing.

# Embarking on a tech-smart earth building pilot

Collaborating with interdisciplinary partners, we aim to develop a new model for the earth sector in Niger. We start by piloting a tech campus in Niamey, envisioned as a model for the region., that includes also aspects of circular economy, solar panels and netzero.

# Pilot project: Constructing an afrofuturist Tech Campus with earth

- Location: Niamey, Niger (Karey Gorou, Tillabéri)
- Planned opening: 2027
- Size: 5 hectares (land purchased in 2022)
- Status quo: Conception, research and analysis phase, partnership building, fundraising

### How we work




